


## Alexander Street Press Streaming Videos – Tips for Faculty

**Background:** The Libraries chose to subscribe to Academic Street Press (ASP) instead Films on Demand (FMG) because ASP contains a significant amount of content that is currently available in FMG, plus lots of additional content including a large set of videos from PBS and BBC, tools for creating custom playlists, additional accessibility features, and other options not available in Films on Demand. Here are some tips to help you with the transition...

### Tips:

1. If you are currently linking to individual FMG titles from Blackboard or your syllabi, **you will need to remove these links by June 30** and replace them with links to the equivalent content in ASP or another source (all streaming video sources are listed here: <http://libguides.eku.edu/az.php?t=32>).
2. In ASP, it is easy to generate a durable link to share with students. Click on the “Embed/link” below the video and the permalink with our proxy address already embedded will appear (this will enable the video to work from on or off campus). Copy that link and share as you wish in Blackboard, Syllabi, emails to students, etc.



3. If there is a specific video in FMG that you cannot locate in ASP, search by topic to see if there are similar videos on that topic. If there are not, and you really need that FMG video to support your course content, contact our Collection Development librarian Victoria Koger ([victoria.koger@eku.edu](mailto:victoria.koger@eku.edu)) so she can explore licensing options for that individual video. Depending on price and availability, we may be able to re-subscribe to the individual title.
